Interactive Workshops

1. Eat Healthy workshop

Demonstration of healthy and nutritious recipes on sandwich-making was a popular workshop. At the same time, a talk on nutrition was conducted to reinforce the need for nutritious food intake.



2. Stay Healthy workshop

Physiotherapists were on hand to guide participants on the appropriate exercises to undertake daily. At the same time, participants had the opportunity to check their body mass index (BMI).

4. Children's Workshop - Stay Away from Tobacco

110 children, age 9 to 16, gathered at the Dewan Orang Ramai at PPR Sri Pantai for a workshop on Anti-smoking. What started as a group of shy and quiet children soon broke out into excitement and laughter as Andy Loh, the Head of Kids Services from Generasi Gemilang engaged them in fun-filled singing and games.

Key message of "Be Cool, Don't Be Fool" was constantly reinforced through interactional teaching and object lesson demonstrating the effects of tar and nicotine to the human body. As the children learned the dangers and negative effects of smoking, they were introduced to a balanced and healthy lifestyle as an alternative behaviour – which comprise of healthy relationships, eating, academics and sports.

Cancer Survivors' Handbook, 2nd edition by Dr Christina Ng


A book designed to help cancer patients better understand their condition and the rigours of treatment so they are better prepared for the days ahead.

Getting involved - Volunteers' stories

I was invited by my friend, Mr. Ong who is a volunteer in EMPOWERED!, to attend a briefing at a convention hall in Sunway Hospital in March. Not knowing what to expect, I walked into the convention hall on that fateful day, and six months later, here I am sharing with you my experiences in this great life-saving project.

My role in the colon cancer screening project was to provide emotional support to those who were thought to have higher risk of having colon cancer after the initial test. On the day we broke the news to these individuals, some of them cried and some were terrified. Fortunately we have had some training and role-play (thanks to Mary Anderson and other wonderful volunteers) so we could manage the situation.

I learnt that I didn't really have to do anything special or say some words of wisdom in order to make them feel better. Most of the time, I only looked and listened to the individual with concern, and this was good enough. It was an empowering moment, not only for that individual but for me as well. I am looking forward to contribute again to such meaningful projects in the future.

"Before I participated in colon cancer screening workshop, I enjoyed eating "cili api", raw or cooked in variety of styles and a must-have at every meal. My diet consisted of hot spicy foods, which I think caused me to experience stomach discomfort from time to time. But I could not resist.

At the workshop, I took part in the screening test and the exercise workshop. The results from the screening test caused me a lot of anxiety, as blood was found in my stool! For days, I could not sleep and kept thinking of the worst. I was so scared! However it was a great relief to know, after colonoscopy, that the condition was due to piles and not cancer.

It was an awakening period for me – from that day onwards, I eat less "cili api" and practise the exercises I learnt at the workshop. I am very grateful to EMPOWERED! for conducting this workshop. I hope EMPOWERED! will organise more workshops and I will surely encourage my family, friends and neighbours to participate in these life-saving projects."
